

Casework

The driving force of Housing Options Scotland in 2023/24 was, as always, our mission to support disabled people, older people, and members of the Armed Forces Community to be informed about their housing options.

The number of people approaching us for help was at a **record high**. Housing Options Scotland's diverse range of project strands means that the range of situations our clients present with was wider than ever – and our **person centred approach** was as crucial as it's ever been in helping people understand their options.

Every local authority in the country was represented in our statistics for the year, as well as cases coming in from the rest of the UK, and beyond.

Despite a challenging environment, with the cost of living crisis affecting many of our clients, feedback collected has continued to be **very positive** - with **90%** of those surveyed stating they were **happy** with the service overall.






440 Clients

Homeless Housing Options Scotland (HHOS) is a more recent strand of our work. The service has allowed us to provide emergency support to people who are in housing crisis within 24 hours, and more broadly support people who are homeless or at risk.

We saw a marked increase in clients with **440 referrals**, a **+52.7% increase** compared to last year, and a **10% increase** in the total proportion of clients too, bringing homeless and at risk clients up to **40% of our overall caseload**.

Making Moves expands and enhances our service by offering advice aimed specifically at **younger disabled people**, particularly those looking to live independently for the first time. We provide easy to read information and in depth planning meetings which are focussed on **getting it right the first time**.

We are pleased to have seen another increase in client numbers in the third year of this service, up by **51.5% compared to 2022/23 – with 100 younger disabled clients** being supported by us in 2023/24.








Our longest running specialised project, **Military Matters** offers housing advice to **members of the Armed Forces community** - veterans, service
leavers and those currently serving alike, as well as their families.


As a percentage of our overall casework, in it's 11th year Military Matters has remained steady with 24% of our cases - that's 263 households. Homelessness was overrepresented, with 46.6% of Military Matters cases identifying as homeless or at risk.

We also delivered a range of briefings at Armed Forces bases around the country, aimed at preparing them for life on "civvy street."

Our Military Matters project would not be possible without the generous support of the Veterans' Foundation, the Rangers Charity Foundation and The Worshipful Company of Grocers.

a service aimed at Local Authorities, charities and other organisations who work with disabled people, older people and the Armed Forces community, providing direct, tailored **advice and support to frontline workers**. The service was well received and was used by a range of organisations all over the country.

Equality in Housing Podcast



Our **Equality in Housing Podcast**, delivered in partnership with the **UK Collaborative Centre for Housing Evidence (CaCHE)**, went from strength to strength in 2023/24.

We produced **10 episodes** across a range of challenging topics rooted in **equality**, **diversity and inclusion in housing**, with a variety of experts representing academia, the third sector and people with lived experience. 2 of these episodes were recorded live in front of an audience at **Scotland's Housing Festival** and **SCVO's The Gathering**.

As well as the **challenges** different groups face when accessing housing, guests highlighted examples of **good practice** happening all over the country too.

We were honoured and delighted to be awarded the Marion Gibbs Award for Equality in Housing at CIH Scotland's Housing Awards in October.

How Volunteering Helped HOS

Our volunteers turned their hand to a whole host of activities for us in 2023/24.

- Our Housing Buddies have helped 10 clients this year, including supporting clients to complete application forms and checking in with clients over the phone.
- Our volunteers have acted as HOS
 Ambassadors at events throughout the year.
- They even conducted sectoral research for us, which will support us to engage with the sector even more in the 2024/25.





The volunteers were particularly instrumental in helping us to develop our Later Life

Planning Leaflet. This is a guide designed to get people thinking and talking about their housing as they get older, so that they can be prepared before their housing becomes unsuitable for them. Our volunteers acted as test drivers during the design process and provided invaluable feedback.
